Aware of the French Polynesian environmental and cultural wealth and willing to defend its authenticity, our hotel Tahiti Resort & Spa has been fully involved in sustainable development actions.

The InterContinental Tahiti Resort is a Polynesian style resort with 246 units spread out between overwater bungalows and three storey buildings with different types of rooms. The resort has two restaurants, three bars, two swimming pools and a fitness and spa centre named “Deep Nature Spa” managed by the Algothorm society. The hotel also offers a wide range of activities such as two tennis courts, a diving center and island exploration tours.

With a view to introducing our local ecosystems to our guests, our gardens include notably a botanical and ornithological trail, a Tahitian vanilla plantation, ten beehives as well as a Lagoonarium, a true natural aquarium hosting the Te Mana o Te Moana association (protection of sea turtles).

As part of our sustainable development approach, we are committed not only to protecting our environment, but also to ensuring the well-being of our employees and the protection of their rights. To this end, we have set up a regional CSR strategy (We Care), an IHG action plan (Green Engage), and we have been trained for Eco Fenua Engagé certification at local level.

We are committed to:

- Complying with all relevant legislations and regulations of French Polynesia
- Respecting human rights, fighting sexism in the workplace, and pay particular attention to workplace safety
- Recording, benchmarking and improving our environmental performance according to the targets fixed by Green Engage and GreenView
- Encouraging development and integration of sustainable technologies (solar panels, solar water heaters)
- Tracking, analysing and optimizing our energy consumption (gas, fuel, propane, electricity)
- Tracking, analysing and reducing our water consumption
- Managing and reducing our use of chemicals (e.g. chlorine, household products)
- Endeavouring to manage and reduce waste by re-using and recycling the resources consumed wherever practical (recycling and composting practices)
- Favouring local employment as well as products and services of local origin in line with our sustainable purchasing policy
- Contributing to biodiversity conservation and develop environmental education programs
- Involving our guests, colleagues, suppliers and contractors in our efforts to protect the environment
- Promoting local culture by participating in community actions and local events
- Communicating our policies, practices and programs to our employees, customers and partners (e.g Eco Fenua Engagé)
